CLASH OF THE TRIBES



This is our year end report on all things technological in our school, in two broad categories as below:

COMPUTER CLASSES

This is an overview of the computer classes that the Grade 8 and Grade 9 learners are doing in our school. These classes are designed to equip our learners with the foundational computer skills necessary for success in the modern world.

Our computer classes focus on a range of essential skills, including keyboarding, practical applications of Windows, Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and responsible internet usage. Learners ultimately gain proficiency in these areas, which will contribute to their overall digital literacy.

The knowledge and skills gained in these classes will not only benefit them academically but also in their future careers. Digital literacy is a vital skill set in today's world, and we are committed to preparing our learners for success.

ROBOTICS

We are excited to share with you an update on our high school robotics programme. Our learners have been engaged in a wide range of activities, that have not only sparked their interest in robotics but also developed their skills in various areas.

One of the key activities in the programme has been the use of flowcharts. Learners have been introduced to this visual representation tool, which helps them plan and organise the sequence of actions required to achieve a specific outcome. By creating flowcharts, learners are learning to think logically and systematically, skills that are valuable, not only in robotics but also in many other aspects of life. Another important aspect of the programme has been the identification of car components and their functions, including sensors.

Building the car itself has been an exciting and rewarding experience for our learners. They have worked collaboratively in teams, following step-by-step instructions to assemble the car from scratch. This activity has not only enhanced their fine motor skills but also fostered teamwork, problem-solving and attention to detail.

Coding has been a fundamental component of our robotics programme. Learners have been introduced to coding for melodies, allowing them to compose their own tunes using the car as a musical instrument. They have also learned to code for forward and reverse movement, enabling the car to navigate through various obstacles. Additionally, students have explored coding for making turns and spinning, which has expanded their understanding of how to control the car's movements effectively.

Block coding has been another key skill that our learners have developed. Through block coding, learners have been able to programme the car to perform a series of actions using drag-and-drop blocks. This approach makes coding accessible and enjoyable for learners of all levels, and it serves as a step-

ping stone to more advanced programming concepts.

In addition to the in-class activities, our learners have also completed online courses that complement the curriculum. These courses have provided them with additional resources and challenges to further enhance their understanding of robotics and coding. By engaging in online learning, learners have developed self-directed learning skills and a growth mindset.

We are proud of the progress our learners have made in the robotics programme. Through their participation, they have gained valuable technical skills and also developed important 21st-century skills such as critical thinking, collaboration, and creativity. GO-BOKKE-GO


