My Comrades Journey:

When asked for my description of my journey around the Comrades Marathon, I did not doubt that I wanted to share my experiences.

The Comrades race is aptly called The Ultimate Human Race for many runners in South Africa, as well as hundreds of international runners who go beyond themselves to make the start of this iconic race. The race celebrated its 95th edition this year, and we ran on the 28th of August.

The race also inherited its name from the original World War veteran race in which members of the army decided to run this famous route from Durban UP to Pietermaritzburg and subsequently vice versa DOWN from Pietermaritzburg to Durban.

The runners were all meant to be comrades to each other. They ensured that they carried each other through the finish and that no runner was left behind.

I cannot say enough to describe the history of this race, which consists of approximately 90km between the two cities.

There are also numerous conditions and expectations for all runners to be able to qualify to run this race. One of the main ones that every runner will let you know; is that you must be able to run a standard 42km marathon in 4h50 min; however, if you cannot, you will not be allowed to compete. The Comrades also, most importantly, teaches you about principles of ENDURANCE, COMMITMENT, DEDICATION, PREPARATION, and finally, PERSEVERANCE.

My first qualification happened in 2015 when I ran from Durban to Pietermaritzburg in a time of 10h25, and even if I must say so myself, very unexpected and unprepared. I subsequently achieved what is also known as your BACK-TO-BACK medal, when you run two consecutive races of the Comrades Marathon in a much better time of 9h45. After that, I joined an elite running group that could complete the race in under 9 hours and achieved a medal called: Bill Rowan. I produced my best result in 2018. I ran the race in 9 hours and 15 minutes. Unfortunately or fortunately, depending on which side you look at it, I have realized that due to my age possibly, I will probably never be able to run it sub 9 hours without maybe even hurting myself in the long run. I accepted that I comfortably finished the race in under 10hrs and got a medal called Robert Mtshali, the first black runner to finish the race in under 10hrs. This year I completed my 7th race, which came with a shocking, wonderful send-off from all our staff and learners. The surprise blew me away and added to the pressure of meeting their expectations. I am still grateful for that day and the videos. I will keep them for as long as possible!

I finished my 7th race in 9h35 minutes, knowing with all my heart that I tried my best! The future target with my journey in this race will undoubtedly be to run three more races and then earn what they famously call my own Green Number. I will receive my number to keep for perpetuity, meaning forever and as long as I live! Only an elite group of runners who have completed 10 Comrades Marathons achieve this! Once I have achieved that, I guess I will possibly start slowing down or scaling it down for enjoyment. After the race and with all the pain and suffering we endured. We all promised never to participate in another race, but we are there again year after year. I will be there the again next year on the 11th of June 2023 to run another one! Please wish me luck and a kind thank you to all at RSA for the support you have given to me in this regard!

Academic Quality Assurance

The Academic Quality Assurance Team was established in January this year to focus on academic quality assurance in all our schools. The main focus of the team is to ensure excellence in the preparation and delivery of lessons in all grades and subjects. This was accomplished by the following projects implemented during the year:

- Subject specialists, with proven track records and results, were identified and appointed to mentor, guide and support subject teachers in specific subjects and grades.
- Common tests and exams, set by these subject specialists, were administered in terms 1 and 2 in specific subjects and grades. This allowed the Academic Quality Assurance Team to identify areas that needed intervention and support in terms of lesson preparation and lesson delivery.
- Systemic tests were administered in Grades 1 to 9 in October in English Home Language, Mathematics, Natural Sciences and Technology. The higher order cognitive levels of the learners were assessed in these subjects, as well as their ability to "think outside the box." The results of these tests will be used to identify educators that are in need of support and development in order to teach the learners to apply themselves using the higher order cognitive levels. Workshops and training sessions will be held to support our staff.
- Google Workspace was implemented as an enrichment platform for learners. Training and development was offered to the educators throughout the year, to ensure that this platform is utilised to enrich and to reinforce what was taught in the classroom.
- Intervention and support strategies were offered to the schools in subjects that were not performing at an acceptable standard. Some of these strategies included the introduction of weekend boot camps, afternoon classes, Saturday classes and school holiday classes.

In 2023 our team will be expanded so that the academic standards in our schools can reach greater heights and our learners can excel in their academic performance.
