Academic Quality Assurance

RAAQA (Royals and Amberfield Academic Quality Assurance) is a team that was introduced in January this year to focus on academic quality assurance in all our schools. RAAQA's main focus is to ensure excellence in the preparation and delivery of lessons in all grades and subjects. This was accomplished by the following RAAQA projects implemented during the year:

- Subject specialists, with proven track records and results, were identified in some of our schools to mentor, guide and support subject teachers in specific subjects and grades.
- Common tests and exams, set by these subject specialists, were administered in terms 1 and 2 in specific subjects and grades. This allowed RAAQA to identify areas that needed intervention and support in terms of lesson preparation and lesson delivery of a good standard.
- Systemic tests were administered to Grades 1 to 9 in mid-October in English Home Language, Mathematics, Natural Sciences and Technology. The higher order cognitive levels of the learners were tested in these subjects, as well as their ability to "think outside the box." The results of these tests will be used to identify teachers that are in need of support and development in order to teach the learners to apply themselves using the higher order cognitive levels. RAAQA will be offering workshops and training to these teachers.
- Google Workspace was implemented as an enrichment platform for learners. Training and development was offered to the teachers throughout the year, to ensure that this platform is utilised as a platform to enrich and to reinforce what was taught in the classroom.
- Intervention and support strategies were offered to the schools in subjects that were not performing at an acceptable standard. Some of these strategies included the introduction of weekend boot camps, afternoon classes, Saturday classes and school holiday classes.

Due to the academic excellence that we want in our schools, our team will be growing next year so that the academic standards in our schools can reach greater heights and our learners can excel in their academic performances.

Academic Challenge

Queens Private School took part in the first Royal Schools Academic Challenge. Top learners from Queens were chosen to partake in various categories in the academic challenge. The learners did exceptionally well in the challenge. Each learner playing to their various strengths. Quite a few Trophies were brought home by Queens' learners. The learners definitely took the spirit with them to this challenge and won a well-deserved first place for the spirit trophy.
