

INTERMEDIATE PHASE

ACADEMICS

On the 25th of July 2024, our intermediate phase learners, Andile Ndhlalambi and Wayne Sherekete, proudly represented our school at the annual Natural Science & Technology Olympiad held at Laerskool Wespark. This Olympiad is a competitive examination designed to spark learners' interests in science, promoting hands-on learning, critical thinking and overall enjoyment and engagement.

The academic enthusiasm didn't end there. On the 17th of August 2024, our learners eagerly took part in the annual Academic Challenge at Royal Schools Princess Park in Arcadia, one of our sister schools. This challenge explored learners' strengths across a range of disciplines, including Mathematics, General Knowledge, Chess and Spelling.

School academic challenges contribute significantly to learner development for several reasons:

Critical Thinking Skills: Challenges encourage learners to analyse, evaluate, and synthesise information, developing critical thinking and problem-solving skills vital for real-world situations.

Resilience and Grit: Facing academic challenges helps learners persevere, building resilience and equipping them to tackle future difficulties both in and outside school.

Self-Confidence: Successfully overcoming challenges boosts self-esteem and confidence, encouraging learners to trust in their abilities and approach new tasks with assurance.

Preparation for Future Success: Rigorous challenges prepare learners for higher education and careers by instilling skills in time management, organisation, and the value of hard work.

Encouragement of Lifelong Learning: Confronting and overcoming challenges fosters a growth mindset, encouraging learners to view learning as a continuous journey.

Collaboration and Communication: Many challenges require teamwork, allowing learners to build collaboration and communication skills essential in academic and professional environments.

Personal Growth: Academic challenges often push learners beyond their comfort zones, leading to personal growth and a deeper understanding of their strengths and areas for improvement.

Lastly, we recently concluded our Systemic School tests in English, Mathematics and Natural Sciences & Technology. These tests are designed to evaluate the education system as a whole rather than focusing solely on individual student performance. They assess the effectiveness of educational policies, curriculum and teaching methods across schools or districts.

Key features of the systemic tests include standardisation, comprehensive coverage, data analysis and an overall assessment of learner performance.

Funky Civies Day





ACADEMICS

Academics are often seen as limited to the classroom. However, this term, our school introduced exciting ways to extend academic learning beyond classroom walls, offering our learners fantastic opportunities to engage with like-minded peers from various schools across the city.

Grade 12 Exam Preparation Bootcamps

Our Grade 12 class embarked on a final push strategy with exam preparation bootcamps on the 4th and 11th of October. These comprehensive and intensive programmes were designed to equip learners with essential skills and knowledge for outstanding performance in their final examinations.

They also aimed to boost learners' confidence, clarify doubts, and foster strategic learning. Various methods, such as mock exams, peer collaboration, personalised mentorship, and interactive sessions, were employed to achieve these objectives.

Academic Challenge

The school participated in the Academic Challenge event, which brought together all Royal Schools on the 17th of August 2024 at Royal Schools Princess Park. Our learners competed in General Knowledge, Mathematics, Spelling Bee, and Chess. Two learners from each grade were chosen to compete in each discipline.

The programme aimed to assess knowledge, foster critical thinking, and promote healthy competition. We are proud of our learners who participated and are delighted to announce that we won trophies in FET General Knowledge and for excellent spirit (war cry).

Systematic Test

Systematic tests are standardised assessments designed to evaluate students' performance, comprehension, and retention of the curriculum. They help identify strengths and weaknesses, ensuring that learning outcomes are met across the board. Our Grades 7-9 learners were tested through systematic assessments.

Academic Excursions

Academic excursions bring learning to life outside the classroom, offering real-world experiences that deepen understanding and stimulate curiosity. Museums, science centres, and historical sites present a wealth of opportunities to explore.



Our learners from Grades 7-9 had the chance on the 23rd of August 2024 to participate in a tour of Soweto, where they learnt about South African history.

Queens participated in the Olympiad TestsO for Grades 10-12. For Grades 7-9, Conquesta tests were conducted in Maths, English, EMS, Natural Sciences, Technology, and Robotics.

These assessments gauge students' knowledge and skills in the mentioned subjects, promoting academic excellence, critical thinking, and problem-solving abilities. Round one was conducted in Term 2, and Round 2 took place in Term 3 for those who excelled.

HIGH SCHOOL NEWS

Discipline Themes

This year, the school successfully implemented four quarterly discipline themes to promote positive behaviour and instil essential values among learners.

Kindness and Respect: In the first quarter, we focussed on fostering kindness and respect within the school.
